Then we had lots of dance music (Jimmy Buffett-style), great entertainment and pictures with Minnie and Mickey.

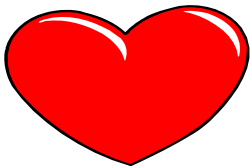
